

Natural Disasters can occur anytime in any place of the world. When they do, the world responds to provide assistance to those afflicted by the tragedy. It is understood that assistance interacts and works directly with the local heroes involved in positive work. Traditionally, we can map out this assistance in three stages:

1st Stage

TRIAGE In this early stage first responders come to the affected areas to:
Survey the extent of devastation.
Give emergency assistance to the living and dispose of the dead
Provide for emergency housing and basic supplies for those in need
Secure affected area for safety

2nd Stage

CLEAN-UP This stage calls for volunteers to assist in:
Survey the extent of devastation.
Dispose of waste products and materials
Identify and make safe any areas that may have been contaminated

3rd Stage

REBUILDING Reconstructing:
Damaged buildings and structures
Infrastructure (roads, bridges, etc..)
Support local business, Trade UNIONS and encourage involvement of local Chambers of Commerce and Local Trade Organizations, schools and country wide YOUTH organizations in starting up again



4th Stage

SOVEREIGNTY Independency & Self-sufficiency:

Using global expertise to ensure that the local population is given the opportunity to be self-sufficient and the capability to go forth on their own.

Providing incentives for expert to teach locals the concepts of:

- Environmental protection
- Natural sustainability in business,
- Green concepts for living

Foreign organizations to establish sustainable businesses by providing them with incentives such as:

- Land
- Supplements for employee salaries
- Funding for the difference for clean energy
- Guaranteed contracts
- Safety through the protection of the OAS troops

Setting time line for transferring land back to locals

The Plan Reforesting

HAITI, THE CAPITAL OF CERTIFIED TIMBER

Because historically Haiti has been devoid of natural resources, it follows that the locals do not have the knowledge of how well managed natural resources add to the economic sustainability of a population. The fourth stage is focused on using the environment and replenished natural resources to create jobs and ignite the spark that will enlighten and empower the Haitian people to manage their own destiny.

The introduction of reforestation as a natural resource should be flanked by the instruction to the use of clean energy, recycling waste materials and production of eco-friendly products.

WHAT

- Reforesting Haiti with Certified Chain of Custody Forestry
- No fossil fuels - Clean energy only (sub contracted)
- Recycling of paper and other waste materials instead of dumping them on the landfills
- Discourage illegal migration by creating jobs for Hatians
- Haitians for Haitians: Hatians to teach Haitians: "The Haitian Dream"
- Ban the use of Styrofoam products that are causing ecological disasters and replace with products from our certified timber and post-consumer paper waste recycling program.

WHO

PADF – Pan American Development Foundation, with organizations like Wynne Farm and Operation Green Leaves will legitimize and spearhead Stage#4 with major corporations' business leaders worldwide with limited involvements with governmental, religious and non-profit organizations. Their objective is to provide the leadership in structuring organizations and agencies that will bring support for the population until the transfer of control can take place. The Haitian Dream will be created collectively.

SYNDICATES – Transportation, Youth Organizations, Health, Education and other Industries.

HOW

CHAIN-OF-CUSTODY – Certified timber by FSC, SFI, PEFC or Certified Green Partners

SOVEREIGNTY, Stage 4 – Using global expertise to ensure that the local population is given the opportunity to be self-sufficient and the capability to go forth on their own, create a system to bring experts in sustainability to work with locals in creating a long-lasting action plan.

WHEN

Stage #4 calls for detailed and sound preparation on the front-end. We must start to define the critical path to the goal of establishing sustainability, and for educating the Haitian people in best practices for the environment, agriculture, manufacturing, health and education. This comprehensive stage must be on stand-by and ready for implementation at the onset of the Rebuilding Stage. Opportunities for lasting change occur very seldom. The tragic development of these past few days can be used to provide a clean and promising slate for the Haitian people. Time is of the essence when so much is at stake. There is a lot to be accomplished!

WHERE

DECENTRALIZATION – Starting with local and foreign organizations outside of the major cities and towns with the cooperation of local governments, Unions, Youth Groups and established NGO's in the respective areas.

Business Leader

Visionary, entrepreneur, and philanthropist who combines an entrepreneurial business sense with creative energy and dedication to purpose. During his 47 years in the printing industry, Gus Casamayor has become a nationally recognized industry leader.

Thirty-five years ago, Gus Casamayor founded AC Graphics, a commercial printing business dedicated to quality and service. Then, only three years ago, Casamayor found out that the printing industry was one of the major contributors to worldwide contamination because it is the third consumer of petroleum products in the world and it is responsible for the destruction of forests due to its consumption of paper from devastated forests.

Immediately after realizing this, Casamayor made a decision to change in order to prevent the damage caused by the printing industry. From that moment on, AC Graphics began to use certified paper and vegetable-based based inks, making it the first triple-certified green printing business in the State of Florida. However, he realized that he could not tackle this crusade by himself, so he decided to make it his mission to educate and help others become more ecologically minded in order to help future generations.

His compromise has gone farther than others expected for he has initiated a system that will help businesses, schools, government agencies, and other organizations to become Certified Green Partners. This certification ensures that certain procedures are followed which prove to others the seriousness of their intent to maintain an environmentally responsible work ethic.

In addition, Gus has another mission: the reforestation of Haiti "ReGrow Haiti". He is presenting a plan to Haiti's President René García Prével and his Congress, which delineates how to help Haiti become a leader in sustainable and well-managed forests. This plan will enable Haiti to supply the world, starting in about 10 years, with certified wood and certified pulp to help satisfy the demand of certified paper at a lower price. This will, in turn, give work, solutions, and hope to one of the poorest nations in the world. Gus' plan involves the three worldwide organizations that certify sustainable forestry (FSC, SFI and PEFC), scientists, professors and university students, professionals, energy and paper industries and even the United Nations. If all these agencies and people unite in this important endeavor, there will be hope for Haiti. "If we give Haitians trees" says Gus, "they will only eat for a few days, if we teach them how to plant and sustain trees; they will eat for a lifetime"
